We received 378 responses from students.

What you told us...

79% agreed that the use of digital technologies was convenient.

rated the quality of the digital learning environment as good or above.

agreed they had engaging and motivating digital learning resources.

agreed we provided students with formal recognition, accreditation or certification for their digital skills.
