# Agenda:

- Feedback from the programme
- Discussion on various themes including general feedback, course content, timetabling, Piazza, Blackboard, future career prospects, and assessments

## **Discussion Points:**

## 1. Introduction and Purpose

 Alexandra Hennessey started the meeting and explained the agenda, focusing on feedback from student representatives

# 2. General Feedback

- Students appreciated the friendly and approachable nature of lecturers and the engaging lectures, especially on technical topics like neuroscience and statistics
- Some confusion regarding the seed orientation timings was noted
- The academic writing workshop was found helpful, especially for those returning to academia

# 3. Course Content

- Students found the course content interesting and engaging, encouraging critical thinking
- Some students with a background in psychology found certain topics basic and suggested more in-depth content

# 4. Timetabling

- The timetable was appreciated for its detailed structure and timely communication of changes
- Students liked the handling of disruptions and the quick adaptation to changes

#### 5. **Piazza**

- Piazza was found useful for quick responses from instructors and seeing common queries
- Some students were initially put off by the number of notifications but appreciated the ability to adjust them

#### 6. Blackboard

- Blackboard was helpful for accessing lectures, slides, and resources
- Some students found it challenging to navigate and suggested better guidance on accessing resources

# 7. Future Career Prospects

- Students expressed interest in knowing more about lecturers' backgrounds and research experiences
- There was a desire for more communication within the departments and guidance on career pathways

#### 8. Assessments

- Assessments were found reasonable with good resources and guidance
- The research proposal cafes were appreciated for brainstorming ideas
- Suggestions were made for more practical writing exercises and feedback

## 9. Other Suggestions

- Use of tools like Padlet for questions during lectures to avoid disruptions
- Preference for lecture slides in PowerPoint format for easier annotation

#### **Action Items:**

- Ensure clear communication of orientation timings
- Consider more in-depth content for students with a psychology background
- Continue timely communication of timetable changes
- Remind students about adjusting Piazza notifications
- Provide better guidance on navigating Blackboard
- Share more information about lecturers' backgrounds and research
- Organize more career guidance sessions and networking opportunities
- Implement practical writing exercises and provide feedback
- Explore the use of Padlet for managing questions during lectures
- Provide lecture slides in PowerPoint format
