How to access registration and the lecture theatres



Alliance Manchester Business School (building number 29 on the map), Booth St W, Manchester, M15 6PB

Once inside the building, please report to the reception team to direct you to the registration area outside of the second-floor lecture theatre 2.008.

The reception team will guide you through the glass gates to the right of the reception desk, then go straight ahead towards a big staircase. Either take the stairs or lift to floor 2 then carry on straight ahead until you see signs for the registration and conference.

The registration will be outside of lecture theatre 2.008 where the initial welcome by Professor Anthony Rafferty and first plenary talk by Professor Karen Niven on Tuesday 21st will be held. The plenary talks starting at 10.45 on Wednesday 22nd will also be held in this theatre.

Toilets are available on the ground floor to the left before the stairs and to the right before reaching the room on the second floor.

The presentation sessions will be held on the third and fourth floors – please take the lift or stairs to the right through one door up to these floors.

Signs will be available outside each room to confirm the session titles.

The tea and coffee breaks and buffet lunch will be held on the third floor Hive events space near to the session rooms.

Water fountains are available throughout the building so <u>please ensure to bring a water</u> bottle.

Directions for lecture theatre G.003

The Work-Net launch on Tuesday 21st from 4pm and Gary Younge's keynote lecture on Wednesday 22nd 4-5pm will be held in the large lecture theatre on the ground floor (G.003).

Tea and coffee will be available before each event outside of the lecture theatre.

The theatre is near the entrance of the building – coming from the second, third and fourth floors, head back towards the big staircase and the theatre is to the right at the bottom of the stairs.

Following the Work-Net launch, there will be a drinks reception, then the conference dinner will be held in The Mill, next to the lecture theatre.
