Essential:

- Creativity, problem solving, and critical challenge with respect to research and ideas

- Familiarity with the devolution and regional rebalancing agendas (such as levelling up or the Northern Powerhouse)
- Ability to produce maps

Project Outline

the leading think tank for the North and England's regions, publishes an annual flagship report called the State of the North. It is our most highprofile report and plays an important agenda setting role for regional development and the North, from influencing levelling up to the need an Industrial Strategy that is both green and place-focussed.

Every year, we work with our Q-Step intern to develop the theme for the year, and then plan and undertake the research—which involves data and can include analysis public opinion work. Themes have included the political power of Gen Z across England's regions, comparing regional inequality in the UK to comparable countries, redefining levelling up, and building regional economic resilience in a time of global uncertainty.
