Competitions and Markets Authority (CMA)

As a University, we must provide critical information to prospective students for them to make an informed decision about what and where to study. One aspect of this is ensuring our website is up-to-date as students research which universities to apply to. This takes place during the annual web audit which was completed a couple of months ago for those students starting in September 2026.

Another aspect is providing students who have been offered a place with us more detailed durable information so they can make an informed decision regarding their firm and insurance choice ahead of the UCAS deadline on 6 June. This piece of work is for students starting in September 2025 and is being coordinated by our CMA subgroup of the Teaching and Learning Delivery Operational Management Group. The team are working hard to ensure the information we have is correct before it is sent to offer holders. An overview of the timeline for this work is given below – we are currently at Phase 3:

 \cdot Phase 1: February 2025 - course titles match for Spotler e-mails (CS - Dynamics and Marketing Information)

• Phase 2: March 2025 - AIR table structure and related CUIP information to be checked and updated [Note: the deadline for programme amendments is 31 March each year]

• **Phase 3: April 2025** - Durable information in Marketing Information to be checked (1-11 April) and then amended (14-30 April)

 \cdot Phase 4: 1-9 May 2025 - Final sign-off of durable information from each School – you can see the content of these e-mails in the Media Library

• Phase 5: 12-16 May 2025 - Durable e-mails sent by Student communications and Marketing Team through Spotler

The UoM Teaching Excellence Awards 2025

Submissions invited for awards recognising a significant and sustained commitment to excellence in teaching and learning

Do you or your team have a track record of excellence in delivering or supporting teaching and learning? Do you know someone whose consistently excellent practice deserves more recognition? We are now inviting nominations for the 2025 Teaching Excellence Awards. The Awards celebrate evidence of significant and sustained commitment to teaching, learning and/or the student experience over recent years. Academic, Technical and Professional Service colleagues are eligible for the award, which may be made to individuals and to teams of up to 15 people. Nominations should demonstrate excellence in support of one or more of the following strategic themes for teaching and learning:

- Educational Leadership
- Inclusive Education
- Flexible Learning and Digital Delivery
- Assessment and Feedback
- Student Voice

The Award

In addition to being awarded a trophy at a formal awards ceremony, Teaching Excellence Award

winners will become Honorary Fellows of the Institute of Teaching and Learning, receive a digital badge that can be added to their email signature, be offered personal development opportunities and invited to play a role in the development of teaching and learning across the University.

How to nominate yourself, a colleague or a team

All nominations must be made on the <u>Teaching Excellence Case for Award proforma</u> and submitted as a word.docx via the <u>online submission portal</u>. Evidence should be included to support the case, and all submissions should consider the extent to which students are engaged in a form of partnership.

Within the proforma, colleagues are encouraged to make their case using the format which best allows them to highlight the reach, value and impact of the nominee's work. Options are a 1000word written submission or a five minute pre-recorded presentation (this may be narrated slides, a video or other approach). Additional formats may also be approved, in advance, by agreement with the Institute of Teaching and Learning.

Each submission will be considered against criteria of Reach, Value and Impact, which map to those used for the national <u>Advance HE Teaching Excellence Awards</u>.

Complete nominations, including supporting statements/signatures, must be submitted to the Institute of Teaching and Learning via the <u>online submission portal</u> by 7pm BST on Monday 02 June 2025.

The Panel

The nominations are evaluated against the criteria by a panel that includes nominated representatives from each Faculty as well as the Head of Student and Academic Services (or nominee) and is co-chaired by Dr James Brooks and Dr Jen McBride as University Academic Leads for Teaching Excellence & Quality.
