### **Travel Strategy: Key Updates for Managers**

In February, we launched a brand new <u>Travel Plan: 2025-2030</u> aimed at promoting sustainable travel and affordable transportation options for our community. Important components of this strategy, such as our electric vehicle (EV) offer, have since been announced.

These are summarised below with key information for you to easily communicate these changes or schemes to your teams.

# Changes to car parking charges will take effect from 30 May

A In February 2025, further details were provided regarding the University's new Travel Plan for 2025-2030, which aims to encourage more sustainable transportation options for our community while also ensuring fairness and affordability. As part of this update, changes to the car park charging policy will take effect from 30 May 2025, along with the introduction of a new Electric Vehicle (EV) charging tariff.

### Free Bus Trial from Manchester Victoria

Between Tuesday, 6 May and Monday, 30 June, we're trialling free travel on the 41 bus for all colleagues. Simply show your university ID to the driver at Manchester Victoria (Stop NU) and enjoy a free journey straight to campus. During the trial, the bus will:

- Be available any time of day during Bus 41 operating hours, Monday to Friday
- Provide easy access from Manchester Victoria to campus (and return)
- Be completely free just show your university ID
