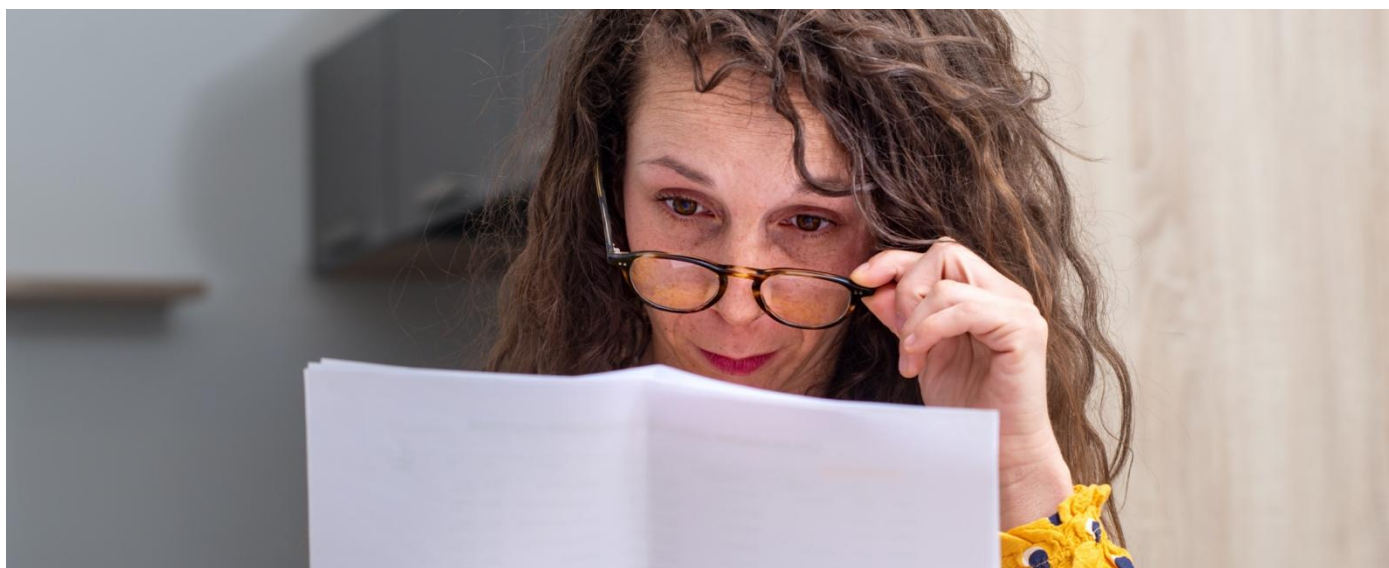


# Writing to patients from rheumatology Healthcare professionals - Workshops



**We are looking for rheumatology healthcare professionals to take part in a research study**  
**We want to work together to encourage and support writing clinic letters directly to patients**

Current guidance recommends writing clinic letters directly to patients. However, this does not always happen. We want to develop resources to encourage and support writing clinic letters directly to patients. (We will also be inviting patients to take part in the same study, and share their views on what might help).

## You can take part if you:

- ✓ **Currently provide healthcare to adult patients attending rheumatology** outpatient department(s) in the UK NHS / HSC, **and**
- ✓ **Write letters summarising these outpatient consultations** (either to the GP or the patient)

## Taking part would involve attending one or more online workshops:

- We are planning three workshops with a mix of both patients and healthcare professionals.
- We will ask you to share your views on our study findings and what might help healthcare professionals write clinic letters to patients.

Each workshop would take about 90-120 minutes.

They will take place online via videocall.

## Provide some information about yourself:

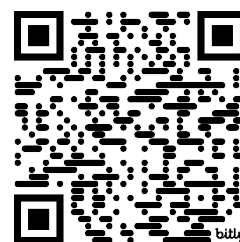
- For example, your age, gender identity, ethnicity, job role, name and contact details.
