We have produced a <u>Feedback Form</u> that we are kindly asking colleagues to fill in. This is open for those who attended on the days, but also to colleagues who engage with the slides and the recording in their own time.

### Student Voice Data Collection Update

As agreed by the Programme & Curriculum sub-group of TLD OMG, we will be streamlining the data request process to reduce additional workload during busy periods for school colleagues from 2025-2026 onwards. Accordingly, we are now commencing the collection of 2025-2026 data within schools.

Colleagues have been contacted and asked to provide relevant course unit survey data for both Semesters of 2025-2026, indicating if units should be surveyed in semester 1, 2 or both. All units listed will also need to share the information of the relevant academic who leads the unit, as they will be provided access into DIG (Data Integrity Gateway) to review the data, as worked successfully in 2024-2025.

The deadline for all data to be submitted to the team (teachingandlearningsurveys@manchester.ac.uk) is Friday 29th August 2025
