

## The University of Manchester Global Futures Scholarship Eligibility and Application Criteria – 2026 awards

### South Asia– Undergraduate Scholarships

Award Value: £10,000 per year for up to 3 years (subject to attainment of 60% average in each year)

#### Eligibility

Eligibility will be based on meeting the following criteria:

1. Applicants will only be considered for these awards if they are domiciled in one of the following countries: Bangladesh, India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka. To be considered as domiciled in these countries applicants must have predominantly resided there during the last three years.
2. We consider your permanent country of residence to be the country in which you are ordinarily resident, not a country where you are only living for the purpose of full-time education.
3. Eligibility is based on domicile as defined above rather than nationality.
4. Awardees will be selected based on academic merit, but we will endeavour to achieve a balance in the allocation of the awards by gender, domicile, qualification type and course of study. We may also give greater credit to applicants for courses of study where students from this region are underrepresented.
5. The awards are only open to candidates applying for direct Year 1 Entry and who have, or are working towards one of the following qualifications:
  - A Levels
  - IB Diploma
  - Indian Standard XII (CBSE, CISCE, Maharashtra, West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Gujarat)
6. Applications for the scholarship should be submitted on the dedicated online form **by 26 March 2026**.
7. A link to the online application form will be emailed to relevant offer holders. We cannot accept late applications under any circumstances.
8. Applicants must accept Manchester as their Firm UCAS choice by **25 May 2026**.
9. Applicants for Medicine (MBChB), Dentistry (BDS), Architecture or any courses with an integrated foundation year are not eligible for the award.
10. Students do not need their final results in order to apply for a Global Futures Scholarship.
11. Where an applicant has not yet received their results at the point of making a scholarship application, academic merit will be assessed based on predicted grades from their school and results of any previous tests or examinations.
12. The decision of the selection panel is final, and appeals will not be considered.
13. Should an applicant be offered a Global Futures award and then fail to meet the academic offer conditions for course originally applied for, the scholarship offer will be withdrawn.
14. Students taking Indian Standard XII must have satisfied all academic and non-academic offer conditions of their course including English language by 31 May 2026.

15. Students taking IB must have satisfied all academic and non-academic offer conditions of their course including English language by 10 July 2026.
16. Students taking A Level must have satisfied all academic and non-academic offer conditions of their course including English language by 20 August 2026.
17. In addition to meeting the course offer conditions you must also satisfy certain minimum grades to be eligible for the scheme. These are as follows:
  - A Level: AAA
  - IB: 36 Points
  - Indian Standard XII: 90% for national board; 95% for Maharashtra Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Gujarat state boards; 85% for West Bengal state board (the overall average will be calculated across the five best academic subjects. Co-curricular/ supplementary subjects cannot be included)
18. Students must meet the specific course offer grade requirements as well as the above minima.
19. Applicants must be classified as 'international' for tuition fee purposes.
20. The scholarship cannot be used in conjunction with other University of Manchester awards.
21. Applicants must be self-funded (i.e. not fully funded by an external government agency or commercial funder).
22. If the amount of University of Manchester awards plus any external part-funded scholarships exceeds the total cost of the tuition fees, the tuition fees will be covered in full, but no payment will be made to the awardee.
23. Awardees must seek approval from the International Office before making any changes to the programme of study, this includes course changes or any interruptions of study.
24. The award is for courses starting in September 2026 and cannot be deferred (i.e. postponed to a later intake cycle).
25. The award applies only to full-time courses of study delivered at The University of Manchester's UK campus in Manchester. Applicants for blended and distance learning programmes are not eligible for the award.
26. Applicants who have previously studied in the UK are not eligible for the award.
27. Applicants must complete all sections of the application form. Incomplete forms will not be considered in the selection process.
28. Students may only submit one scholarship application even if they apply for multiple courses. Where students submit multiple scholarship applications only the first will be considered.
29. Where a student has applied unsuccessfully for MBCHB or Dentistry but then is subsequently made an offer for a different course, the student will be eligible to apply for an award.
30. The award is granted for up to three years dependent on achieving overall marks of at least 60% in exams each year.
31. Where students register for a course with a Year in Industry, the award will be applied to Years One, Two and Four. The continuation of the award to Year Four will depend on performance in Year Two.
32. Successful candidates will be expected to work with the international recruitment team from time to time to serve as a student ambassador for the University during their period of study to help inform prospective students about study at Manchester. This may involve such activities as: attending physical or virtual presentations for prospective students; providing written or filmed testimonials/ vlogs and blogs for the University's website; or serving as an advocate to help promote the scholarship programme. It may also include the University's use of certain identifying data (such as the scholarship recipients' names, nationalities and courses of study) in the context of the above and related activities. The time commitment for ambassador activities should not typically exceed 8 hours per semester.
33. We will pass your details to our Division of Development and Alumni Relations who may contact you following graduation.

NB. For visa purposes, under UK Visas and Immigration regulations you must be able to demonstrate that you can pay the remainder of your tuition fees as well your living costs.

Awarding timeline Process. We will notify all successful applicants of the outcome of their award by **1 May 2026**
