We address the key questions that shape cities in the 21st century to realise more inclusive, equitable and socially sustainable urban environments for current and future generations.


Aligned with The University's core values, we build partnerships among researchers, communities, policymakers and industry. These collaborations drive co-produced solutions at local, national and

global levels, ensuring our research leads to meaningful, evidence-based outcomes.

MUI draws on expertise from across The University of Manchester's three Faculties to bring together diverse interdisciplinary perspectives. We use innovative methods and action-based approaches to inform impactful policy and practice.

This report highlights some of our key achievements over the last academic year.

AN ENRICHED RESEARCH ENVIRONMENT



The academic year 2024 - 2025 has been a period of transformation and development for MUI.

Under the leadership of incoming
Director, Professor Karen Lucas, and a
new management team, we have
reshaped our research environment to
strengthen collaboration, enhance
external partnerships and deliver
greater impact.

MUI's research is structured across four Research Challenge Areas intersected by three cross-cutting themes.

This renewed research environment was shaped through a collaborative consultation process during 2024 and 2025, ensuring that it reflects the priorities and perspectives of our diverse constituencies.

COLLABORATION & DEVELOPMENT

In the last year, MUI has grown its global footprint and delivered tangible change closer to home.

Recent collaborations extend from Los Angeles to Dhaka, while partnerships with organisations including **Transport for Greater Manchester, Arup, Stockport MDC**, and community partners such as **42**nd **Street and The Dandelion Community** strengthen our local impact.

We hosted study visits from **QEERI** (Qatar), **K2** (Sweden), and **The Cooperative Housing Federation of Norway**, and engaged with global policymakers, including a Dutch ministerial delegation.

MUI supported an international urban forum constituting members of our Postgraduate Researcher (PGR) Network and counterparts from UCLA Luskin School of Public Affairs, laying foundations for long term professional cooperation and development.

We were awarded funding for two major international conferences through **The**University of Manchester Hallsworth Fund.

These are planned for 2026 and will continue to expand our global reach.



EVENTS & ACTIVITIES

Supporting the next generation

MUI is a launchpad for emerging researchers. In 2024 / 2025, we:

- Launched an Early Career Researcher (ECR) Network
- Expanded our PGR Network to 55 members
- Funded nine ECRs and PGRs to present at international conferences
- Appointed ECRs as deputy leads across key research challenge areas
- Initiated a new blog series to amplify ECR and PGR perspectives.

Catalysing change

MUI convened forums to bridge divides between research, policy and lived experience, creating space for new ideas and equitable collaboration:

- Built Environment and Mental Health Innovation Lab
- Urban Futures Forum
- INTALInC Urban Transport project launch
- Monthly urban film series, interdisciplinary research cafes, and policy focused seminars.

Influencing policy

We have worked to connect people, linking research with practice, and people with policy, to put ideas into action:

- A 12-month PDRA secondment to TfGM influencing Greater Manchester Transport Strategy 2040
- Development of participatory planning models used by Local Authorities
- Strategic frameworks co-created with GMCA and Wigan MDC
- Input into national transport policy debates via Select Committees and advisory boards
