Undergraduate Access Scholarship

Undergraduate Access Scholarship

As a MAP graduate, you will receive:

- £1,300 per year during your undergraduate programme of study

You will receive an email in November to confirm the payment.

Paid in three instalments:

- 25% in early December
- 50% in February
- 25% in April



Undergraduate Access Scholarship

You will still receive the Undergraduate Access Scholarship if:

- You complete a year in industry
- You complete a year abroad
- You complete an integrated master's course
- You are a UoM medical student intercalating at UoM (PG or UG level)
- You repeat a year
- You take a gap year(s) after completing MAP and then starting at UoM
- You switch to a new UG programme of study
- You withdraw from your course before graduation, but come back to start the same/different UG programme
- You take a leave of absence (your scholarship will be on hold until you return to your studies)
- If you also qualify for the Care-experienced, Care Leaver, Estranged student strand of the Undergraduate Access Scholarship, you will receive £2,000 per annum; as you will receive £1,000 for each strand of the scholarship.

You will not receive the Undergraduate Access Scholarship if:

- You re-sit WITHOUT having attendance
- You are a UoM medical student intercalating at a different institution
- You are a final year Nursing/Midwifery student that is only here in Semester 1 before graduating in December



Undergraduate Access Scholarship

Entering your bank details on the University Student System

1. Log into My Manchester
2. Select 'Tools' followed by 'Student Systems' on the left hand side of the page (this should open a new screen in Campus Solutions)
3. Once in Campus Solutions, click on the compass pointer in the top right hand corner and select 'Menu' in the toolbars followed by 'Self Service' and then 'Campus Finances'
4. Then select 'View Financial Aid' (this page shows your awards for the current academic year)
5. Click the 'Bank Details' button and enter and save your UK bank details. *If you have already entered and saved your bank details then the button will not be visible.*

It is essential that UK bank account details are entered so we are able to process your award.

The Manchester Bursary

You MAY also be eligible for [The Manchester Bursary](#), but this is not linked to MAP:

Household Income	Bursary (per year of study)
Below £31,000	£2,600
Between £31,001 - £43,000	£1,300

Must have had a full financial assessment carried out by Student Finance, and consented to share financial details with the University.

You will then be automatically identified by the Students Services centre, and payment will be: 25% in December, 50% in February, 25% in April
