## Registration

You will have received communication from the University Student Services Centre inviting you to complete annual registration.

If you have successfully progressed in your annual review, you will be able to complete the registration online. Re-registration is an essential part of your official status on the programme.

For those who are due to re-register in September, the deadline is 30 September 2025. Failure to register when you are required to may result in the registration termination.

## School PGR Reps

We're pleased to announce the launch of the Humanities PGR Representation Scheme for 2025/26, designed to strengthen postgraduate research representation across the Faculty.

- School PGR Reps (paid pilot role, £150/month stipend)
- Divisional/Cohort PGR Reps (voluntary roles)

The scheme aims to enhance student engagement, feedback mechanisms, and research culture, while offering valuable leadership and professional development opportunities.
