Summary of OFS Sexual Misconduct National Prevalence Data and University of Manchester Prevalence Data September 2025

The results presented in this summary report are based on responses from final year undergraduates at The University of Manchester in 2025. The Office for Students suggest care should be taken in making comparisons of institution level data with the sector level outputs. Several limitations have been raised, limiting the statistical analysis that can be performed. Data are compared to the Office for Students findings for illustrative purposes only. It is not possible to determine if there are any statistically significant differences.

Confidence in Support

- **53.3**% of national survey responders and **67.5**% of University survey responders felt **confident** about where to seek support within their university.
- 44.8% of national survey responders and 29.3% of University survey responders did **not feel confident** about where to seek support within their university.

Reporting

- Only 9.6% of national survey responders and 13.2% of University survey responders) formally reported being sexually harassed to the University.
- Among those who did report:
 - 44.9% of national survey responders and 46.7% of University survey responders rated the reporting process as good.
 - 38.7% of national survey responders and 39.3% of University survey responders rated it as poor.

Relationships with Staff

• 1.5% of University survey responders reported having had an **intimate** relationship with a member of staff in the past 12 months. This is the same figure as for national survey responders.
