PROJECT OVERVIEW

This project will explore how Open Kitchen impacts the community as a whole. This includes understanding its social, economic, and cultural contributions. We also aim to identify other organisations doing similar work and assess whether we are leaders in our field compared to others delivering comparable services and community initiatives.

Open Kitchen collects data on food interception and redistribution, the customers we serve, and the partners we work with. This information helps us measure our impact, understand community needs, strengthen collaborations, and evaluate how effectively we deliver our services compared to others in the sector.

We are looking for students who have strong data skills and a desire to work with a voluntary organisation that brings about real change.

This opportunity will be unique, as you will combine data analysis with first-hand experience working in a community-based organisation. You will deliver important research that can aid in tackling pressing issues across communities in Greater Manchester.

During your time with us, you will gain professional experience in data collection, analysis, and reporting, as well as using more complex software to visualise data. You will also gain valuable experience working in a voluntary sector organisation, developing non-data skills in the form of communication and presentation.

This promises to be a really rewarding and challenging opportunity this summer.
