Undergraduate courses

- Holders of A-levels or the International Baccalaureate (IB) with good grades are considered for direct entry to undergraduate courses. Please refer to the website for standard entry requirements for individual courses: www.manchester.ac.uk/undergraduate
- Students who have successfully completed one of the foundation programmes listed above can progress directly onto Year One of the related degree programme.
- Students who have successfully completed of the Northern Consortium International Foundation Year are guaranteed progression on to the first year of an appropriate undergraduate course in a Northern Consortium partner university (of which The University of Manchester is one).

- Students who have studied on other approved UK-based International Foundation courses are considered on a case by case basis for direct entry to undergraduate study.
- One or more years of study at a leading Chinese university may be considered for a transfer onto an undergraduate degree at The University of Manchester. Contact the Academic School in which they are interested for more information?
- All Students are also required to demonstrate their English proficiency
 on the basis of an approved English language test such as IELTS or
 TOEFL, at the level required by their academic school. Please check
 with your proposed school of study for details.

Postgraduate taught courses

- Minimum requirements (for some courses these may be higher): Students require a a good bachelor degree (a minimum GPA of 3.0/4.0, or an overall average of 80%) from a recognised university (preferably 211 or 985) in China to be considered for admission on to a postgraduate course at Manchester.
- All students are also required to demonstrate their English proficiency requiring an IELTS (or University of Manchester approved alternative) grade of between 6.0 and 7.0 depending on the chosen subject.
- Please check individual course details via the web site for additional requirements such as such as subject knowledge, previous work experience, etc.

Postgraduate research degrees (MPhil, PhD, Integrated PhD)

Postgraduate research degrees are individually supervised, and prospective students are recommended to make initial enquiries direct with academic staff in their academic school of interest before submitting a formal application. A research proposal is required along with the formal application.

 Holders of a Masters degree from a leading university will be considered for entry onto MPhil or PhD courses.

Other programmes within the University consider applications on a rolling basis. Some other programmes may require an application fee or a deposit. This will be made clear to the candidate by the prospective School. Applicants in their final year of an undergraduate degree are welcome to submit their applications before their final degree certificates are available.

Tuition Fees for 2010/11 Entry

Standard tuition fees are set within subject bands. For example, for 2010/11 entry these were:

Arts: £11,700 • Science: £14,700 • Clinical courses: £26,800.

Payment options: Tuition fees can be paid in advance, in one payment at registration or in up to 3 instalments by direct debit from a UK bank account.

Funding

International Standing

The University of Manchester is a world-class teaching and research institution. This is confirmed by our ranking in the influential Academic Ranking of World Universities Survey conducted by Shanghai Jiao-Tong University. For 2010, this survey placed The University 44th in the world, 9th in Europe, and 5th in the UK.

Nobel Prize Winners

The University of Manchester counts 25 Nobel Prize winners amongst former students and staff. This achievement further illustrates the world-leading research being conducted here at The University of Manchester. There are 4 Nobel Laureates currently working at the University, including Professors Andre Geim and Konstantin Novoselov, joint winners of the 2010 Nobel Prize for Physics.

Employability

You can be confident that a degree from The University of Manchester is recognised by employers worldwide. Confirming the University's reputation for producing outstanding graduates, the Times Higher Educational Supplement (THES) World Rankings published in October 2008 found that the world's leading employers ranked Manchester joint first in the UK.

Research Excellence

Manchester's outstanding performance in the Research Assessment Exercise (RAE) 2008 means that now, more than ever, the University can rightfully claim its place as one of the UK's leading research universities.

The RAE is the UK government's formal method of assessing the quality of research in universities. It is based on a large and complex amount of data, and is presented in a different way to previous RAEs.

There are a number of different ways of analysing the results, and in any of these The University of Manchester ranks among the country's top performing universities.

One example is the ranking which looks at the volume of research activity judged to be in the two highest possible quality levels, called 'World-Leading' (4*) and 'Internationally Excellent' (3*). This places Manchester in third position, behind only Oxford and Cambridge: www.rae.ac.uk
